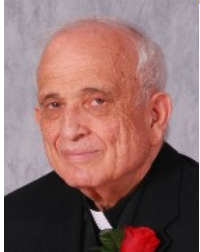

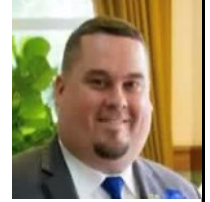

Boy how time Flies I cannot believe we are almost through the first quarter of this year and almost three quarters of the way through the Fraternal Year.

That being said though I do have to be the bad guy and remind everyone that Dues are due! Notices have gone out at the time of me writing this article. I am Happy to say there were a lot less this year than there were last year. But still at the time these reports were run 216 of our Council Brothers have yet to pay their dues. This means the council is currently out \$16,588!!!!

For those who have paid your dues, membership cards have also been sent out. To those who became Honorary or Honorary Life Members in the past year and a half unfortunately the Supreme Council had an issue with the supplier for these cards. They know there two four four five three zero six is an issue and will be sending these out as soon as the supply issue gets resolved.

I thank you all for your support with me as we work through the unpleasantness of billing and collecting dues but I am grateful for the help support and assistance as we work through this. It only helps to keep the council strong and active.

Congratulations are extended to our brother knights who received their Sir Knight Degree on February 22, 2025, in New York City, New York. This special exemplification was performed to celebrate the 125th anniversary of the Exemplification of the Fourth degree of the Knights of Columbus since the Order's inception on March 29, 1882, at St. Mary's Church in

New Haven, Connecticut by Fr. Michael J. McGivney. Knights of Columbus councils in our area will be hosting the Sacred Heart of Jesus Pilgrim Icon during the month of March 2025. Councils are encouraged to organize a Sacred Heart Holy Hour featuring an icon depicting famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome. The reproduction bears the blessing of Pope Francis, through the Papal Almoner, and is one of more than three hundred icons traveling across the world, from council to council, for veneration and use in prayer services.

The Sacred Heart Holy Hour includes readings from Sacred Scripture and reflections from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart, as well as the Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayers to the Sacred Heart and time for silent prayer. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament may also be included. Following the holy hour, families are encouraged to enthrone the Sacred Heart in their homes by placing an image of the Sacred Heart in a place of honor and conducting an enthronement ceremony. Since the first traveling pilgrim icon of Our Lady of Guadalupe in 1979, more than 191,000 council and parish prayer services with some 23 million participants have been held.

The Maryland State Council will host its 27th State Convention at Crowne Plaza Hotel in Annapolis Maryland from May 2-4, 2025. Online hotel reservations at the state council's negotiated discount rates are rapidly selling out. Reservations made after March 1, 2025, may be available at Crowne Plaza Hotel's prevailing rates.

Those interested in participating in the pilgrim icon program should contact their parish's Knights of Columbus Council Grand Knight to find out when and where the Sacred Heart holy hour will take place in your area.

In closing, I wish my brother knights and ladies of the Ladies Auxiliary a happy Easter and encourage every brother knight to reach out to an adult brother parishioner and invite him to join the Knights of Columbus or, a catholic lady and invite her to join the Ladies Auxiliary, and help "Make a Difference in Someone's Life."
