

## Chaplain's Message

## Grand Knight's Message

Lent is a 40-day season beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 18 and running until Holy Thursday, April 2, 2026, which ends the Lenten fast. It's a period which promotes prayerful reflection and characterized by fasting and abstinence.

It's a period of giving up and uncluttering our lives, freeing ourselves from worldly cares and taking on extra prayer and charitable service. We stress

fasting in solidarity with our Lord Jesus Christ, who fasted for 40-days and nights and was tempted by the Evil One.

Jesus implores us through the Gospel readings to seek our "Inner Room". That space where we can pray quietly, where only our Heavenly Father sees. We are called to self-reflection, self-discipline, leading to prayer, and stirring us to action, to love of God and Neighbor.

We need only take a look at the evening news and we see countries posturing to readiness for war, Countries engaged in war with the excuse of preservation and promotion of their agenda.

Many of our neighbors and fellow parishioners have had their lives turned upside down with detention and deportation. The constant threat is creating a mental health crisis in schools, hospitals and faith communities. The collateral damage that occurs when the primary breadwinner is detained or arrested with contractual necessity such as payment of mortgages, rent, car payments, school or college tuition. The financial instability and hardship for the families affected.

A parishioner recently was detained by ICE. His pickup truck and expensive tools he uses in his contracting business were impounded. There is a substantial towing and impound bill to pay before the vehicle can be retrieved. Once his work stopped, his income stopped, and his wife was unable to meet rent, car payments, and putting food on the table. There is extra legal expense for immigration attorneys that must be paid before they will provide counsel or representation, and all of the savings went for attorneys.

His family has an eviction notice, and no ability to meet the mountain of financial obligations. Ultimately, this family will need assistance from the church and from local government, will loose their housing and need shelter, and financial assistance for food, clothing and the basics of daily living.

As this scenario and many similar to it are played out to a huge number, the financial burden will eventually fall on all of us. Let us pray extra prayers for softening of hearts, and be ready to assist and advocate for families who are struggling. Its not a political issue. Its an issue of human decency. Let us remember what Jesus taught us: Love God with all your heart, and love your neighbor. Happy Lent! God Bless you always.

Registration for KofC Camp 2026 began in January. Camp is 9 weeks long, from June 15-Aug 14, and each “session” is one week. We are closed on Friday, July 3rd to celebrate the 250th anniversary of our nation’s Independence!

- \* Camp Sessions are \$275 per week per child, but with the KofC discount, each session will end up \$225/ week. Sibling discounts are also available.
- \* We have fantastic lifeguards at the KofC as well as my hand picked staff of counselors (and I do mean handpicked, I teach at an amazing high school and have selected the most incredible, energetic, caring and responsible staff from my students).
- \* There is a required MDH camper health information form for each child as well as the registration form which should detail their swim level.
- \* The following link contains all registration forms/ information: [kofccamp.wordpress.com](http://kofccamp.wordpress.com) .
- \* Individual swim lessons are available for additional cost.
- \* Enrichment/tutoring is available for additional cost.
- \* Before and aftercare are available for an additional cost.
- \* Campers are divided into three groups based on age, Bigs, Middles, or Littles, and their swim ability is noted daily on the camp roster that each counselor keep on their person along with first aid kits and emergency contact info.
- \* Campers are not permitted to swim outside of the wading area unless they have both 1) permission from parent/ guardian AND 2) passed the swim test by our lifeguards.
- \* Activities include: free play, art, theater, music, dance, sports, story time, and afternoon pool time. Each week is themed and the activities are planned to maximize fun!

Looking forward to having your kids join us for a summer full of fun! Spots have already opened to families who enrolled last summer and each session has 45-50 spots (total) across age categories.


