

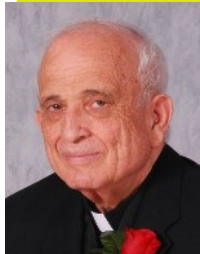

Knights of Columbus, we share a special bond with Christopher Columbus. And, although others had arrived in America first, it was Columbus who opened a pathway to European colonization and commerce and trade between kingdoms and countries.

Charles Carrol of Carrollton was an important founding father and signer of the Declaration of Independence, where royalty and imperialism was rejected, and Democracy was born. In the popular movie National Treasure, he was depicted as a member of Freemasonry together with the majority of other Signers of the Declaration who actually were members of Freemasonry. Charles Carroll was a devoted Roman Catholic, and never joined the Masonic fraternity. This was artistic embellishment by the screenwriters of National Treasure. Charles Carroll was a wealthy businessman. He used his intelligence, political influence, and vast personal wealth to further the cause of Liberty at great personal risk to himself and his family.

Charles Carroll's cousin, John Carroll became the first Archbishop of Baltimore in 1790. Archbishop Carroll was a staunch patriot and helped garner support from Catholics for the continued growth of the new Republic.

Elizabeth Ann Seton was the founding mother of America's social and educational infrastructure, creating the U.S. Catholic School system. Mother Seton was Canonized as the first American Saint. She founded the Sisters of Charity Religious Order.

Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney observed two one six six eight zero one firsthand, how immigrant Catholics were mistreated when they arrived in the United States during the Industrial Revolution. Out of need for social justice was born groups such as the Knights of Labor, the Molly Maguires, and other fraternal groups realizing there is strength in numbers. "A three-fold cord is not quickly broken." (Ecclesiastes 4:12). Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus, providing nurturing for the soul and the concept of fraternal care, if a member died, the hat was passed and funds given to widows and orphans. Now modern-day life insurance provides for family needs.

It was these mainly Catholic immigrant laborers who built the railroads, skyscrapers, factories, canals, cities, and highways. Today, many Catholic immigrant workers are still building our cities, highways, and homes. They harvest our food on the farms, prepare our food in restaurants, and do so many things to make our lives easier.

In recent years, Fr. Mychal Judge, a Franciscan Friar who was the Chaplain of the New York City Fire Department gave his life in service while ministering to first responders during the September 11, 2001 catastrophe.

As Catholic men and women, we participate in Democracy serving as mayors, council members, state elected officials, judges, Members of Congress and Senators. We provide teachers, attorneys, physicians, police and fire officials, and even one president of this great country.

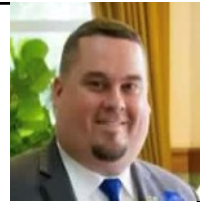

Greetings Worthy Brothers,

I have the privilege to serve as your new Field Agent with the duty to protect Catholic families. Steve Clites is still with us and we are working hard to better serve the Councils.

Our Order was established in 1882 with the goal of providing fraternal benefits to members so that families could survive intact in the event the sole wage-earner was lost. One of Father McGivney's first policies provided \$5/week for 13 weeks if the father of the family became disabled. Men joined the Knights for the insurance programs and ownership of policies was required of all Knights.

Father McGivney could never have dreamed that his Order, designed to protect Catholic families in a few small parishes in Connecticut, would expand across the world and engage over 2 million men in preserving the Catholic faith, preaching the Gospel, and performing works of charity.

One Knight of Columbus even became President of the United States: John Fitzgerald Kennedy.

Today the Knights continue to work to bring about a world aligned with Christ's vision. We are Pro-Life! We provide sonograms and support to women who have made the difficult decision to keep their babies. The abortion business is strong. It is not just a lobby, but a profit-driven behemoth that makes money from misery. Unlike many large insurance providers, the Knights do not support Planned Parenthood.

Reach out to me with any questions about the four main products the Knights offer: Life, Disability, Long Term Care insurances and annuities. I seek the opportunity to discuss with you how each of these fits into family and estate planning. For younger families, Knights' programs can position your children for high-quality lives by protecting them from many of the financial challenges present in the world today.
